

Cut a second piece of the paper to 6.5x14cm, mount on aqua card and fix to the centre of the card front. Cut out the image measuring

11cm square. Blend Frayed Burlap ink across the bottom of the topper, creating the look of sand beneath their feet. Apply Tumbled Glass ink through the Lovely As A Cloud stencil to create a cloudy sky background, working the ink around the images and bringing it down to meet the sand. Double mount the topper on white card, followed by lime card and fix to the top of the card front with foam pads, overlapping the top edge. Add a sentiment below it and Glitter Drops to each corner.

#### It's your birthday

Create a 12.5x17.5cm white card blank. Cut chevron paper to 11.5x16.5cm and mount on coral card, leaving a border. Fix to the card front. Cut seascape paper to 5.5x16.5cm, mount on coral card leaving a border on the long sides and attach down the centre of the card front. Cut out the image to

Attach a button with twine to the knot and adhere centrally below the topper. Add a sentiment with foam pads beneath the bow and Glitter Drops to each corner of the topper. Add highlights of glitter to the sea in the image.

#### Sunshine '

Create a 13x15cm white card blank with the fold at the top.

Cut seascape paper measuring 12x14cm, mount on aqua card and fix to the centre of the card front. Cut confetti paper to 9.5x11.5cm, mount on silver mirri card and fix to the centre of the card front with

foam pads. Cut out the topper and layer on pale pink card. Attach to the centre of the confetti panel. Add three gems to the topper. Add two aqua enamel gems to the bottom left of the topper and three pink enamel gems to the top right. Complete by adding the 'sunshine' Big Chat Sticker to the bottom of the topper.



#### Fabulous friend

Create a 14.5x17.5cm white card blank. Cut aqua background paper to 13.5x16.5cm and mount on turquoise card. Fix to the card front. Cut out the decoupage topper, together with all the corresponding decoupage

the ends to overhang the edges. Select the mermaid decoupage topper. Cut out the whole topper together with the corresponding decoupage pieces. Layer

Attach a die-cut message to the top right of the topper using foam pads, orange dome gems to each corner of the topper and a turquoise glitter gem to either side of the strip.

Layer using foam pads or silicone glue to create the completed scene. Cut out an extra starfish and seagull and attach in place. Add an orange dome gem to the centre of the starfish. Mount on turquoise card, followed by silver mirri card, each time leaving a border. Fix to the top of the card front with foam pads.





#### Summer holiday

Create a 15cm square white card blank with the fold at the top. Cut white seagull paper to 14cm square, mount on aqua card and fix to the card front. Cut a 14x3cm strip of aqua paper and mount on turquoise card. Attach across the bottom of the card front. Cut out the topper and triple mount on pale pink card, followed by silver mirri card and white card. Using a black fine line pen, add

a framed border around the outside of the topper. Fix to the card front with foam pads, overhanging the top edge. Add sequins randomly around the image. Tie a scruffy bow in orange seam binding and fix to the bottom right corner of the card front, adding a sparkly dome to the knot. Print out the words 'summer' and 'holiday' and trim each word to size. Attach to the bottom left corner of the topper.

Create a 18x15cm white card blank with the fold at the top. Cut pink background paper to 17x14cm and mount on pink card. Fix to the centre of the card front. Cut white paper to 17.5x6cm and mount on pink card, leaving a border at the top and bottom only. Attach across the bottom of the card front. Select the mermaids and pelican decoupage topper and trim to 13x8cm, together

with the corresponding decoupage pieces. Layer the pieces using foam pads or silicone glue to create the completed scene. Double mount on silver mirri card, followed by pink card and adhere to the centre of the card front with foam pads. Add some Glitter Drops around the image, together with a few sequins. Mount a die-cut sentiment on aqua card and use foam pads to secure beneath the topper. Cut out the little crab and attach to the sentiment. Adhere a pink sparkle gems to either side of the strip.



#### EMAIL BONUS PROJECTS



#### Stay wild and free

Create a 15cm square white card blank with the fold at the top. Cut pink background paper to 14cm square and mount on turquoise card. Fix to the card front. Cut two vertical strips of white paper, each measuring 14x3.5cm and mount on silver mirri card leaving a border along the left and right sides. Fix to the centre of the card front leaving a space between them. Cut out the topper from the bonus papers and triple mount on silver mirri card, followed by turquoise card and finally another layer of silver mirri card. Use foam pads to

attach across the middle of the card front. Cut out the seaweed and stick to the left of the topper. Add flowers to the bottom of the seaweed, with a pearl in each flower centre. Add glitter highlights to the topper using a glue pen and sprinkling Glamour Dust. Allow to dry.



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

## Back to school with Altenew

"Ah, September! Growing up, the best part of autumn was heading back to school with a backpack full of school





Tasnim's surprising tip? Use the bigger, bullet tip of the two-sided alcohol marker, rather than the fine tip - when you position it straight down, it is easier to maintain control when colouring in detailed areas.

Simple colouring adds an elegant touch to this stamped needlework motif. The flourish was first stamped with blue ink, then coloured with alcohol markers.



For extra shine, accent portions of the motif with a gold metallic pen.

TUST LIKE GOING BACK TO SCHOOL, WITH NEW TEACHERS AND SUPPLIES BUT YES, JUST A LITTLE BIT MORE FUN!

#### LESSON #2: CREATE EASY DIMENSION, WITH STYLE

A layer of foam tape/pads elevates a cut-out element and gives a touch of dimension to a stamped design.

#### A design trick for this card?

Add colour to just a few elements of the design for variety and style. Notice the blossom and large leaves have colour, but the small leaves are left simple black and white? It's a great way to add depth and interest to a card.







This card also offers a lesson in design layout. When adding the clear sequins, Tasnim recommended gluing them in a triangle formation, placing a few at the top right, some at the top left and one at the bottom centre, to create a frame around the focal flower.

Yes, you probably already knew this, especially when mixing paint colours. However, have you ever used it with inkpads? Lydia wanted us to create a purple blossom on the front of this card, but our inkpads were in pinks, reds, blues and greens - no purple! Instead, we stamped the flower first with teal blue ink, then stamped the same image directly on top with ruby red ink. The result is a beautiful dark purple.

#### LESSON #4: USING LOW-TACK TAPE TO MASK AREAS

We know about using Post-it notes to create masks for stamping, but what about masking off a strip across the centre of the card front? Simply place a strip of low-tack tape (Post-it notes and cover up tape is ideal) across the card front, then stamp. Remove the tape and accent the stamped area with strips of white card.

#### Top Tip

Use the bullet point of the alcohol marker to add dots between the stamped flowers. (The gold pen can be used here, too!)



#### LESSON #5: STAMPING INKPAD BACKGROUNDS

Scrapbook pages at a cardmaking workshop? Why not, especially when the techniques used make a perfect crossover into cardmaking! Here, we've simply stamped the small square inkpads randomly over white card to create a stylish background.

Lilith suggested starting in the centre of the page with one line of alternating squares, then staggering more squares above and beneath, tilting them to create movement and interest on the page.



LESSON #6: THE BEST LESSON?
CONNECTING WITH OTHER CARDMAKERS!

With 30 like-minded stampers in the room, one couldn't help but feel inspired! Handmade cards and goodies were exchanged (like those seen here) as we shared our own tips on everything from stamp storage to our favourite ink colours to pets in the craft room. For many of us who connect online, it was a chance to meet our crafting friends in real life.

We talk to...

### Altenew's Jennifer!

Established in April 2014, Altenew has quickly become a leader in the inspiration industry and continues to innovate and influence the world of papercrafts. Editor Sally spent time chatting with co-founder Jennifer Rzasa about phenomenal success of this popular brand.

#### Tell us how your interest in craft started?

I've had an interest in craft from a young age. It started with drawing and painting, then evolved into so much more! I first discovered papercrafting while preparing for my wedding. I knew I didn't want to DIY the entire wedding, but there were certain aspects that I thought I could create myself for a handmade touch. I sewed my own veil and beaded my headpiece with Swarovski crystals. Then, I had this idea of making my own place cards/table cards! I went to the local craft store to see what I needed and saw some cool stuff called embossing powder. It looked elegant and the silver colour fit with my colour scheme so it was calling out to me! I saw embossing ink in the same aisle, so I grabbed some of that. I was ready to go... except I had no stamps! I purchased some pink rubber stamp material and used a craft knife to carve out a monogram with our wedding date. I was pleasantly surprised at how good it came out! Then came the time to stamp and emboss. But what was I missing?! A heat tool! I really wasn't prepared, was I? Instead of buying one, I proceeded to stamp each card,

apply the powder and melt it over a light bulb.
And I did this 140 times!
I was seeing stars and my fingers were burned but it was worth it! I then used a metallic pen to do hand-calligraphy for each guest's name.
That was the easy part!

styles, as well as a few costumes. I also love making jewellery and accessories, and I adore painting with watercolor!

#### Is there something you've made you are most proud of?

This is such a difficult question! Every time I look at a finished project I can instantly remember the process I went through to create it. I know it sounds corny, but that makes each one special! Even the duds! If you want a more specific answer then any card I have had published over the years has made me extra proud. It made me realize there are people out there who want to see my skill and talent. I'm also going to add a non-paper crafted project - I am extremely proud of a particular costume I designed, drafted and sewed from scratch. It took many hours to create, but all the attention I paid to the small details really stood out and made the costume extra fun to wear at one of my favourite conventions!

#### With all this experience can you offer your top crafty tip?

Don't throw anything out! When you make a mistake it can be tempting to throw it

away and start over.
However, you learn so much more when you problem solve! Think outside of the box.
Stamped a sentiment crooked? Stamp it again on a separate piece of cardstock and adhere it on top with foam tape.

Drop your ink pad onto your project? If you are lucky enough and it falls in the background, why not ink up the whole background for a more colourful look? If it's a real disaster, see if you can salvage some of what you already stamped by cutting out certain elements to use on another project. You can also always roll with it - handmade goods are never (and should never) be "perfect."







#### Is there another crafter whose work you most admire?

Yes, and lucky for us she is on our design team! Agnieszka Malyszek wows me with each and every one of her projects. She has an innate ability to create striking and interesting Clean and Simple cards, typically using only minimal supplies! If you are a crafter on a budget, you should definitely check out her work. She exemplifies the phrase "less is more" and does it an artistically beautiful and thoughtful way.

#### What did you envisage when you started out? Did you ever dream that Altenew would be this successful?

Tasnim and I were both paper crafters for quite a few years before we started Altenew. The company really came about after a discussion we had: we were both considering designing our own stamps because there were specific images we

#### Do you still dabble in any crafts other than papercraft?

My first love is paper, I love how it allows you to create a little piece of art that can brighten someones day. I have a box of unmailed cards, I create them faster than I can send them! I also sew clothes for myself - mostly 1940s and 1950s-inspired

were looking for but just couldn't find. We figured if there was a void in the market that we could fill, maybe others would appreciate it too. And by "others" we thought maybe a few people would jump on board and buy our products. We assumed that some of the friends we met through paper crafting would be interested, but that's about it. Boy, were we wrong! On our first release day in April 2014, we launched a collection of 14 stamp sets - most of them were sold out within an hour or two! The rest sold out later that day, and that's when we realised we were onto something.

#### Tell us more about your design team

Having members from around the world is very important to us. Many companies have teams based in the same country as the company. Although that sure does make it easier when it comes to mailing products to designers, I think they miss out on the worldly inspiration that we get with our team. We serve customers all over the world, so shouldn't our team reflect that too? Currently, our team members live in the US, Canada, UK, Ukraine, Pakistan, Australia, Belgium, Slovenia, Germany, Japan, Greece and the Philippines!

#### Tell us a little more about the product design process! For example, what inspires you?

When we started Altenew, Tasnim and I did all of the designing. It was like that for years before we started having some of our team members jump in to the design process. For each of us, the process is a bit different, but we all are on the same page when it comes to what products we want to produce: elegant, unique and inspirational. When I design, I try to take inspiration from nature, architecture and other cultures. I am also very inspired by fashion! I used to run a challenge blog called the Runway Inspired Challenge, where participants would find inspiration to create a paper crafted project from a look straight off the runways of New York, Paris, Milan and London!

#### Have you noticed any trends in cardmaking over the years or have you any predictions for the hobby in the future?

Although Altenew is fairly young, we have certainly seen trends come and go - do you remember when chevrons were all the rage, and no project was complete without three buttons or eyelets in the corner? Instead of focusing on fleeting trends, Altenew

takes a more timeless **66** We serve customers all over approach. Our specialty is our floral collections, we aim to create products that people can use along

with the latest trends, but ones they can also continue to love once a trend has passed.

#### We know that supporting charity is a big part of Altenew's ethos...

Every spring, we host a 'Celebrating Parents' event and card drive. The purpose is to bring love and happiness to seniors in nursing homes or shelters, who may be having a difficult time especially around Mother's and Father's Day. In addition to this we deliver cards to hundreds of seniors and donate a portion of the profits of some of our Mother's and Father's Day themed stamp sets. This past spring we donated thousands of dollars to the Food Bank of Central New York, and prior to that we donated money to the Zakat Foundation. In addition to this successful event, sometimes a donation is included with the purchase of other specific supplies. For example, our ASL Love Stamp Set honors American Sign Language, and a portion of the profits from the sale of this set is donated to charities that support the deaf community.

#### What is your biggest ambition for the year?

We hope to branch out to reach crafters in other areas of the industry. Papercrafting

is HUGE, and we aim to find a place among the mixed-media artists, journal/memory book makers and of course scrapbookers. We have an amazingly talented scrapbook design team and have more scrapbook collections in the works. Keep an eye out for them this year - they are awesome!

#### What Instagram or Facebook account would you follow first after a digital detox?

I hope it doesn't sound bad to say this... but I would follow Altenew's Instagram account! I have still not gotten over the

thrill of seeing a product I designed getting used on a project. It goes from idea, to sketch, to

refined drawing, to manufacturer, to sample, to production, to our designers, to a project, then onto social media! To see everything follow around that path is so humbling. Every single release I notice a designer or customer using a product in a way I never imagined. I think "how did they do THAT with my stamp set?!?" It's unreal, and very inspiring. If I can add one more, I think I'd also follow NASA, since their photos are awe-inspiring!

#### And lastly, something a little bit different -What is the soundtrack of your life?

The soundtrack of my life would be an eclectic mix of classical music (I'm a classically trained violist and music teacher), heavy metal (I acquired my love for metal and classic rock from my dad), showtunes (gotta sing in the shower!), and 90s alternative and hip hop (you can never give up on the music of your childhood!).

#### Butterfly easel

- Print out the sheets on white card using the download and cut out the shapes.
- On the medium and small sized butterflies, score down each side of the body from the head to the tail. Turn the pieces over and fix foam pads to the back of the body only. You will have to cut the foam pads lengthways in half first.
- Score the dotted lines on the main card and bend the bottom half of the butterfly forward to make an easel.

- Stick the largest butterfly on the part of the main card which you have just folded forward.
- Use foam pads (cut lengthways) to attach the scroll shaped stopper to the easel base, across the centre.
- Fix the middle sized butterfly on top of the large one so the body only is attached. Then fix the smallest butterfly on the top.

What do I need? For all cards Computer & printer White card Butterfly easel All items above plus: BE Vintage Pink (cup885478-173) by Carol Dunne for Craftsuprint

Add your chosen sentiment to the stopper panel with foam pads. The butterfly should be able to stand up like an easel and lay flat for posting.



#### Following on from last month's Meet the Maker issue, Carol says...

"I ALWAYS USE PHOTOSHOP TO DESIGN MY CARDS. IF I AM USING A BUTTERFLY AS PART OF A DESIGN SOMETIMES I WILL START BY DOING A DRAWING OF ONE WHICH I SCAN INTO THE COMPUTER. I HAVE TO EDIT THIS TO MAKE SURE THAT THE LINES ARE SHARP AND TIDY AND THERE ARE NO GAPS IN THE LINES BECAUSE OTHERWISE THE COLOURS BLEED OUT WHEN I FILL THE SHAPES. ONCE I AM HAPPY WITH IT I CAN CREATE A STAMP!

TO MAKE THE BACKGROUNDS FOR THESE DESIGNS I ALSO MADE TEXT STAMPS.

I FOUND A FONT I LIKED AND WROTE OUT SOME POETRY. ON TOP OF THIS I PUT **BLOTCHES TO MAKE IT** LOOK VINTAGE, THEN MADE THE STAMP. I STARTED WITH A WATERCOLOUR BACKGROUND WHICH I HAD PAINTED, FADING FROM PINK TO GREY/BLUE. ON TOP OF THIS I USED A NUMBER OF BUTTERFLY STAMPS I HAD MADE, THEN ON THE TOP LAYER I STAMPED MY

#### Impossible card

Print out the pieces using the download and cut them out.

2 On the base card cut along the solid lines and score the dotted lines.


Hold the card in your left hand and rotate the right-hand piece backwards so the card is flat and the centre piece stands upright.

Use adhesive to stick the 'L' shaped piece on the left in place and then the 'L' shaped piece on the right.

5 Fix printed ribbon across the front and another strip across the back, adding a printed button to either end.

Glue the central image in place on the central section which stands up.

Score down the sides of the butterfly's body and fix to the upright panel using a foam pad which has been cut lengthways, so that only the body is attached.

Perfect pens!

Elizabeth Robinson is Brand Ambassador for Royal Talens, the company behind the brilliant Sakura Gelly Roll pens and presenter of all things Sakura on Hochanda! She tells us a little bit more about herself and these fabulous pens!



I have been drawing, doodling and sketching all of my life. I live at the seaside on the beautiful coast of North Wales, so much of my inspiration comes from all things fun, whimsical and

seaside related. There's not a day goes by without creating something, so when I was asked if I'd like to showcase Sakura on Hochanda I did a backflip I was so excited.

The Sakura brand is renowned for quality, colour rich pigment and technology, they are always finding ways to improve the products.

The Gelly Roll pens have been around since the mid-eighties, and are just as

popular today as when they were first introduced to the market. I love that you can work on many different surfaces, did you know you can create fabulous effects on fabric using the Metallics and Stardust pens? For mixed media projects the Glaze and the Soufflé pens are a must as you can apply them over acrylic mediums.

I love to watercolour using the Metallics and Stardust pens, so let me introduce you to Freddie the Flamingo. I drew him using a pink Metallic pen onto a piece of watercolour card. Then very gently with a

> water brush, dragged the colour out to create shading. I added a layer of the pink Stardust pen over the top, and again dragged the colour out, to spread the glitter. Once he was dry I added his blue eye, white Gelly Roll highlights and gold crown. What Flamingo doesn't need a crown! To create the border I drew lines using the

Metallic blue around the edge of the card and dragged the colour to fade inwards towards the centre. Once dry I went around the border this time with a Pigma Micron pen, just to add a few finishing touches.

Have fun with your pens, and I hope you love them as much as I do.

# By the sea

# What do I need? For both cards White & orange card 8x8 paper pad & Ephemera pack from the Sunkissed collection by Graphic 45 Rosettes Thinlits & Metallic Kraft Stash by Tim Holtz Die-cutting machine Frayed Burlap Distress inkpad Crystal Glamour Dust Ivory thread You and me by the sea All items above plus: Blue card Blue paper flowers

Night Sky Glitter Drops by Tonic Studios

#### You and me by the sea

Create an 18x20cm white card blank. Cut the Sand Dollars paper to 17x19cm and machine stitch a border around the edges (this is optional). Mount on orange card and fix to the card front.

2 Cut Floating Floral paper to 15x17cm and using scissors or a distressing tool, distress the edges. Ink the edges with Frayed Burlap. Mount on orange card and fix to the centre of the card front.

3 Select the 'You and me by the sea' card and double mount on Turtle Time paper followed by blue card,



leaving a thin border each time. Attach to the left of the card front with foam pads.


Select a small double-sided card with the turtle on one side and Carte Postale on the other. Distress and tear the edges, then place under the right side of the large card, post card side face up.

Die-cut three rosettes from Splish Splash, Floating Floral (striped side) and Sail Away papers and make up as per manufacturer instructions. Add the circular centres in coordinating papers. Attach two rosettes to the bottom left of the image and the others to the bottom right. Attach two paper flowers around the rosettes.

Cut out one of the word strips,
'The sun, sand & sea', from the Kids
At Play paper and trim to one sentence.
Ink the edges and mount on blue and
cream striped paper. Attach across the
centre of a rosette.

Add two small Glitter Drops to either side of the strip.

Using a glue pen, add highlights to the sea on the image. Sprinkle Glamour Dust over the wet glue and tap away the excess.





4 Using a further piece of the Under the Sea paper, die-cut the largest Rosettes die and also the circular shape from coordinating paper and make up as per instructions. Fix to the bottom left of the image panel.

Cut out the 'You are my sunshine' word strip from the Kids At Play paper and cut down to just one sentence. Ink the edges and mount on blue patterned paper. Attach across the centre of the rosette.

Add small dots of Glossy Accents to the bubbles on the image and sprinkle Glamour Dust over the top. Tap away the excess and leave to dry.

Add a large gems to the top left and right corners of the image panel.

#### What do I need?

- All items at start plus:
- Blue seam binding
- Glossy Accents
- ☐ Blue adhesive gems

#### You are my sunshine

1 Create a 17.5x18cm white card blank. Cut Sail Away striped paper to 16.5x17cm and use a pair of scissors or distressing tool to run along the edges creating small rips and tears. Ink the edges with Frayed Burlap and machine stitch a border. Mount on orange card, wrap seam binding around the bottom and attach to the card front.

2 Cut out the little girl from the Sunkissed paper to measure 14.5x13cm. Distress the edges of the paper and ink with the Frayed Burlap. Double mount on Under the Sea paper followed by orange card, leaving a thin border each time. Fix to the centre of the card front with foam pads.

3 Fussy cut 'Sunkissed' from the same sheet of paper, cutting around the wording, some flowers and the starfish. Attach to the bottom right corner of the image panel with foam pads.

By distressing the edges of the papers, it creates a lovely vintage feel.

# Super circles

"I have used a basic circle shape with the same supplies from Pinkfresh Studio on every card, but each has its own technique to set it apart! A change in technique can give your project a whole new look – I have used a shaker, glitter embossing and inking!" Isha

#### Shaker

Die-cut two circles from white card using the largest circle die. Score one circle about 2.5cm from the top. Score a horizontal line and mountain fold. This will be the back of the card.

Adhere double-sided tape above the score line. Attach to the other circle, creating your card blank.

Die-cut a slightly smaller circle from aqua card. Die-cut the mandala from white card and a white frame which fits the mandala from white card. Fix the two together.

Attach acetate to the back of the mandala. Apply foam pads all around the back of the acetate, making sure that there is no open space left. Add some chunky glitter to the centre and fix the aqua circle on top. Fix the shaker to the centre of the card front.

5 Stamp the sentiment on aqua card using VersaMark ink. Sprinkle with white embossing powder and heat to set. Die-cut using a small circle die.

Die-cut black card from the next size circle die, layer the sentiment in the centre with foam pads and fix to the middle of the shaker.



Stamp the bird on white card and colour with Copic marker pens.

Cut out and adhere to the sentiment circle.

#### Glitter embossing

Follow Steps 1 and 2 from the previous card to create your white circular card blank.

Dab the Distress inks onto a craft mat. Apply a little water to your brush, pick up the colours in turn and

create a wash over the card front. Allow to dry, then splatter some black ink.

Die-cut an aqua frame using the largest die. Fix to the card front.

Die-cut the mandala from white and cover with VersaMark ink. Sprinkle three colours of embossing glitter and heat to set. Shake away the excess and adhere to the centre of the card front.

Stamp the sentiment using VersaMark ink on aqua card and emboss using white embossing powder. Die-cut using a small circle die. Take the next size of circle die and die-cut vellum.

> Layer together with foam pads, then attach to the centre of the card front with foam pads.

> > Stamp the bird image on white card and colour using Copic marker pens. Cut out and adhere to the sentiment circle.

Inked background

Create your white circular card blank using Steps 1 and 2 from the first card.

Die-cut a white circle one size smaller than the card blank. Sponge the Distress inks around the centre, adding more colour to the very centre. Flick some water over the ink for added texture.

Use black ink to stamp the sentiment in the centre of the inked area. When dry, fix the circle to the card front with foam pads.

Salty Ocean & Cracked Pistachio Distress inkpads R29, R08, YR07, YR04, Y17, Y15, Y13 Copic marker pens

What do I need?

Inked background

All items at start plus:

Die-cut the mandala from white card and die-cut a small circle from the middle of it. Die-cut a small frame and fix around the small circle. Attach over the inked area with foam pads.

Stamp the bird on white card, colour using Copic marker pens, then cut out. Adhere to the card front.


The postage stamp square

Adhesive pearls

#### Postage stamp square

- 1 Cut green watercolour paper from the paper pack to 13cm square and mount on beige card measuring 13.5cm square.
- 2 Cut floral paper to 10.5cm square, mount on beige card measuring 11cm square and fix to the top right of the panel. Cut daisy corner paper to 10cm square, mount on a 10.5cm square of beige card and fix to the bottom left of the panel.
- Attach cream hessian across the panel and trim the edges flush. Wrap ribbon around the hessian and secure the ends at the back. Attach the panel to the card front with the fold at the top.
- 4 Stick white doily to the middle of the card front. Print out the A6 Drifting Along topper and die-cut using a Double Stitched Circle. Mount on beige card and attach to the doily using foam pads.

The scalloped square -



- Add a bow from the same ribbon to the left of the ribbon strip and add a wooden button to the knot.
- 7 Stamp'with love' using Desert Sand ink on white card and trim to size, rounding the corners. Mount on beige card, round the corners and fix to the top left of the card front with foam pads.
- Add three pearls to the bottom right corner to finish.







#### Scalloped square

1 Cut blue watercolour paper to 13cm square and mount on beige card measuring 13.5cm square.

Trim daisies paper to 11.5cm square, mount on beige card measuring 12cm square and fix to the centre of the panel.

3 Cut a 13x4.5cm strip of daisy paper, mount on beige card and stick across the middle of the panel. Wrap ribbon around the middle and secure the ends at the back. Fix the panel to the card front with the fold at the top.


#### Kitty xx

Attach a white doily to the right of the card front. Print out the A6
Delightful Daisies topper and trim to 10x8cm. Round each corner and mount on beige card measuring 10.5x8.5cm again rounding the corners. Fix to the centre of the card front with foam pads.

Arrange paper flowers around the bottom left corner and secure in place.

Stamp 'thank you' using Desert Sand ink on white card and round the edges. Mount on beige card, round the edges and attach to the top right corner with foam pads.


Add three pearl hearts to the bottom right to finish.

### Dainty daisies

"Have a go at creating your own dimensional flowers - these daisies were so quick and fun to make! They sit superbly against these decorative ovals that I have used in three different ways; on an easel, a large card blank and a stepper card." Chenyl

### Easel

Create a 10cm white square card blank. Score the card front diagonally from the top left corner down to the bottom right corner. Fold to create the easel card blank.

Cut a 9cm square of patterned paper. Edge the paper and the base of the easel with Night of Navy ink. Adhere the paper to the base.

Have a Beautiful Day

Die-cut two ovals from white card and one oval from the paper pad using the fourth largest oval. Edge each one with Night of Navy ink.

Attach one white oval to the folded over section so it stands upright. Dampen/spritz the back of the second white oval and the patterned paper oval.

Run the ball tool from the flower shaping kit along the edge of the die-cuts to give a frilly edge. Layer together with foam pads and fix to the white oval.

Using Night of Navy ink, sponge onto white card measuring 15x11.5cm. Spritz with water and add a small amount of Brusho to create a background. Allow to dry, then die-cut using the middle-sized oval. Adhere to the patterned oval using foam pads.

Cut a sentiment from the paper pad into a strip and stick across the ovals.

Use the step by steps overleaf to create the daisies. Make a hole in the centre of each one and thread through the stamens. Secure the stamens with a small amount of hot glue and, when hardened, trim the excess from the back of the flower.

Stamp the leaves in Granny Apple Green ink on super smooth card and die-cut. Colour using a sponge dauber with the same colour ink. Spritz the reverse of the leaves and shape using the flower shaping tools. Position the flowers and leaves on the easel and secure with hot glue.

Use Smoky Slate ink to stamp the daisies on super smooth white card.



Place the coordinating die on top of the daisies and tape into position using low tack tape. Die-cut.



Snip away the card holding the petals in place.



Ink the edges and centre using Daffodil Delight ink.



Spritz the back of the flowers with water. Shape the flowers using the flower shaping tools.

Die-cut an oval from patterned paper using the second smallest die. Ink the edges in Night of Navy and layer the sentiment in the middle using foam pads.

Follow the step by steps to make the daisies, adding prills to the centre, and Step 8 from the previous card to make the leaves. Position the flowers and leaves around the sentiment using hot glue.

### Card blank

Create a 17.8x13.3cm white card blank. Place the large oval die on the card so that approximately 1cm of the folded side will not be cut. Die-cut to create an oval card blank.

Die-cut two large white and one patterned oval. Edge each one with Night of Navy ink.

Dampen/spritz the back of the ovals and run the ball tool from the flower shaping kit along the edges. Layer together and fix to the card front.

Stamp the sentiment on white card with Night of Navy ink, cover with clear embossing powder and shake away the excess. Heat to set. Die-cut into an oval using the smallest die.

### Stepper

1 Cut white card to 20.3x10cm. Score at 2.5cm, 5cm and 12.7cm from the left. Mountain fold the outer lines and valley fold the middle line to make a mini stepper card blank.

2 Cut an 8.5x10cm piece of white card. Score down the centre and 1cm from the outer edges. Valley fold the score lines and attach to the inside of the large stepper to strengthen when standing.

Cover the large step and the front step with patterned paper.

Edge with Night of Navy ink.

Die-cut a white oval using the fourth size and edge with Night of Navy ink. Adhere to the large step.

Die-cut a second oval from the paper pad, spritz lightly with water and run the ball tool along the edge to make a frilly edge. Attach to the white oval.







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

### Layers of loveliness

A DL card blank is so simple and is the perfect base for lots of layers of pretty papers, die-cuts, chipboard embellishments and 3D flowers to make your design stand tall!

### Pretty in pink

Create an 11x20cm white card blank. Select wood effect paper from the paper pad and trim slightly smaller than the card front. Distress the edges with a distressing tool or pair of scissors and fix to the card front.

- 2 Cut pink floral paper to 8.5x17.5cm. Distress the edges and fix to the centre of the first layer.
- Die-cut the Ornament 26 from white card and attach to the top left corner of the card front.



### What do I need? For both cards White card Lovely Day paper pad by Mintay Mama's Porch Flowers chipboard Ornament 26 die (OR36) & Frame 2 die (DR5) by Scrapman Die-cutting machine Small & medium 3D balls Natural sisal Pretty in pink All items above plus: Ivory seam binding For the flowers: Leaves dies (002) by Lady E 0.6mm white foamiran 1mm white matt stamens Lipstick jungle hybrid inkpad by LDRS

- Cut out the flower image, distress the edges and wrap ribbon around the middle, securing in a bow on the left.

  Layer on cardboard to strengthen if you wish and attach 3.5cm from the top of the card front.
- Die-cut a frame from white card and attach to the bottom right of the card front. Fussy cut a cluster of flowers and also a large open flower add to the top of the frame, attaching some natural sisal behind them.
- Stick the heart chipboard to the bottom of the flowers, adding 3D balls on top.
- Attach a bunch of natural sisal and some cut-out leaves behind the top left corner of the flower image.
- Make three lilies following the Flower Spread Tutorial published in the Crafteezee blog, on 26th June. Attach two of the flowers around the cut-out flowers and one in the top left corner of the card front.



### Lovely in mint

Create an 11x20cm white card blank. Select white floral paper from the paper pad, trim slightly smaller than the card front, then distress the edges.

Trim mint dotted paper to 9x18cm, distress the edges and stick to the centre of the card front.

3 Cut out the house image, distress the edges and layer on thick cardboard to strengthen if you wish. Fix to the left-hand side of the card front.

Die-cut the Ornament 26 die from white card. Make a seam binding bow and a wax cord bow, then layer together with the die-cut in the top right corner of the card front. Cut out some leaves and tuck under the die-cut.

Die-cut a frame from white card and fix to the bottom of the card front tucking it under the house image.

Cut out a flower cluster and fix to the bottom right of the house image, adding 3D balls to it. Add some natural sisal and a chipboard element above the cluster.

To make an open flower, cut three layers of foamiran using the second

pretty foamiran flowers, visit www.crafteezee.blogspot.com

For a detailed tutorial on how to make

largest flower die. Using a wet wipe, apply a little Lipstick Jungle on one of the sides and Mermaid Hair on the other. Repeat with each layer.

Gently twist each petal between your fingers and carefully stretch it. Stick the layers overlapping one another, pushing the centre of the flower with a flower tool

into a kitchen sponge. Apply a bunch of white stamens in the centre of the flower. Fix to the die-cut in the top right corner.

Use the 13cm and 10cm star dies to create card blanks from black card with the fold at the top. Use the 10cm and 5cm star dies together to create a frame from black card. Use the 7cm star to die-cut black card. Set all to the side.

Create three 15cm squares from white card. Blend a third of the card with Worn Lipstick, a third with Peacock Feathers and a third with Chipped Sapphire. Blend Black Soot around the edges bringing it into the square by about 2.5cm. You can see the Distress inks create a galaxy effect inside the Black Soot outline.

Flick water and white acrylic paint over the squares.


Die-cut one square with the 13cm star die, another with the 10cm and the third with the 7cm. Fix the two larger stars firmly to the card blanks set aside earlier so that the inks are diagonally across. Fix the 7cm star to the 7cm black star in the same way. Fix all three shaped cards together as shown, fixing the points at the rear of the card to the left. Fix the black frame firmly to the centre card.


Use black ink to stamp the spaceman, the rocket and the alien on white card and fussy cut. Colour the images as shown. Use white ink to stamp 'Blast off' on black card and trim to size.

Fix the images and sentiment to the card as shown, using a mini wobble spring for the rocket and foam pads for the spaceman and alien.

> Make It Colour Blending card was used for the stamped elements as it works well with alcohol markers!

Watch the rocket wobble on a spring!

### Hello hexagons!

Three hexagonal shaped cards, in three different styles! Create a die-cut scene, a shaker or use inlay die-cutting — which is your favourite technique?

### Die-cut scene

Fold white card in half. Trace around the largest hexagon die on a scrap of card and use a ruler to measure a 2cm line parallel to each side all the way around. Cut out the shape with scissors and you have a template you can use time after time for larger

shaped cards without dies. Trace around the template on your card front and cut out, making sure a side on the left is still attached to create your shaped card blank.

Run the FarmScape die through your die-cutting machine twice with white card, allowing enough space below the die-cut line to fill your hexagon shaped card front.

3 Place the top layer with the barn over the card front and hold in place temporarily. Turn it over, trace the outline of the hexagon where it overhangs and trim with scissors. Mark a light pencil line where the hill lies and remove the layer.

4 Create a semi-circle mask from scrap card and blend over the top of the card front.

Colour the barn, tree and fence with markers and use Distress oxides for the remaining areas of grass. Adhere this layer to the card front.

Colour the tractor and tree on the next layer in the same way as before and ink below them. Layer below the first die-cut with foam pads.

Use the hexagon template to cut a small strip from white card. Blend with orange and brown inks, stamp the fence along the top edge and cut out with a craft knife. Attach to the bottom of the card front with foam pads.

Stamp, colour and fussy cut the chickens, hen house and eggs.

Attach around the bottom of the card front. To create the bushes, use the leftover trees you cut off the die-cut layers, remove the trunks and add around the hen house.

Finish by stamping a sentiment at the bottom of the card front.

### TOP TIP!

By trimming off different elements from border die-cuts you can get different looks so it appears as though you have used different borders for each layer!



#### TOP TIP!

Trim away the chickens' legs – they are easier to draw in again with a fine liner than to cut out!





Inlay die-cutting

Follow Step 1 from the previous card to create your shaped card blank from white card, using the largest hexagon die.

Take the largest die again and put the next size down inside it, tape them together to ensure the gap all the way around is even and die-cut from white card to get a hexagonal frame.

Die cut two more large hexagons from white card and place one in

the centre of the Coverplate die. Mark the position on the die with a pencil and run through the die-cutting machine.

Using Squeezed Lemonade, Fossilised Amber and Wild Honey oxides, blend an ombre effect on the remaining white hexagon.

Using your marks as a guide, place the inked hexagon back in the exact same place as the white one and run through your die-cutting machine.

Adhere the white floral frame to the card front. Piece the inked die-cut pieces back into the frame to make a solid background. You can either leave the pieces in the die and place each piece in like a jigsaw (my preferred method as I find it fun to do) but if you want to speed it up, remove the die-cut carefully and use transfer tape on the front so you can transfer all the pieces in one go.



Adhere the frame over the top.

Stamp the llama and his rug and colour with markers before die-cutting. Fix to the bottom left of the card front. Finish by stamping a sentiment directly over the background pattern.

### Honey bear shaker

Use Step 1 from the first card to create a white shaped card blank, using the largest die.

Follow Step 2 from the previous card to make two yellow frames. Use the same technique to make two more frames from orange fun foam. Die-cut the large hexagon from acetate.

Stamp the card front with rows of honeycomb in yellow. Stamp the tree, bears and bee hive on white card and colour with pencils. Cut them out Stamp the grass and bees directly onto the acetate, colouring the bees from behind.

Layer the foam frames together and adhere to the card front. Fill the inside with sequins. Layer the yellow frames together and add to the acetate. Attach over the top to create your shaker.

Stamp a sentiment on yellow card and trim into a banner shape on the right. Trim the left to attach against the top of the hexagon frame and secure in place on the acetate.

### Score a tri!

"A triangular card blank immediately makes your design look abstract and different from the norm. Decorate with layers of patterned papers for a bright look – I'll bet you've never tried this shape before!" Xeven

### Light bulb moment

1 Fold white card and position the fold at the top. Create a triangular card blank by die-cutting with a large triangle die, placing the top point of the die above the fold line, so it does not cut the fold.

2 Cover the card front with patterned paper. Die-cut a small triangle from the centre of the card front. Cover the card inside with patterned paper.

Die-cut a triangular frame from patterned paper and adhere to white card for strength. Add to the card front at an angle.


4 Stamp and die-cut two bulbs.
Die-cut the bottom screw part of the bulb, stamp with embossing ink and sprinkle with gold embossing powder.
Heat to set.

Blend Squeezed Lemonade and Fossilized Amber inks onto the bulbs. Stamp the inner part and colour with a glitter marker. Sandwich some thread between the two bulbs and adhere together. Hang the thread from the inside of the aperture card front so its hangs inside. Add the bulb screw to the top of the card front with foam pads.

Stamp'shine' on white card and trim into a strip. Stamp again on scrap paper and trim each letter to form a mask. Stamp again, slightly offset, using Electric Lime ink. Remove the mask and attach the strip to the bottom of the card front with foam pads.







LET YOUR LIGHT Shine

## What do I need? Let your light shine All items at start plus: Neutrals Glitter paper pack by Concord & 9th Spiced Ginger Aqua marker by Tonic Studios Acetate

### Let your light shine

Pold white card and position with the fold on the left. Follow Step 1 from the previous card to create a triangular card blank but position the shorter flat side above the fold line. Cover the card front with patterned paper.

2 Die-cut two smaller triangles from patterned paper and arrange on the card front.

3 Stamp the outside edge of the bulb with the sentiment within. Add some Aqua marker at the bottom to give some 'shine'.

Add a thin strip of green patterned paper near to the fold and trim the ends flush.

Die-cut the rays from gold glitter paper, adhere to acetate and cut out. Fix to the back of the bulb and attach to the left of the card front with foam pads.

- Neutrals Glitter paper pack & Star
  Turnabout die set by Concord & 9th
- Clear Mark embossing ink, white embossing powder & Urban Graphite Glitter marker by Tonic Studios

### Shine

Follow Step 1 from the first card to create your white triangular card blank, using a slightly smaller die.

Die-cut the same sized triangle from green patterned paper, graphite glitter paper and pink striped paper. Adhere the pink striped triangle to the card inside, trimming to fit.

3 Using the Star Turnabout die, die-cut twice on the green triangle and layer on the graphite glitter triangle. Fix to the card front.

4 Cut a strip of pink paper and stamp the sentiment at the bottom. Fix to the bottom of the card front and trim the ends flush. Trim a wider strip of purple paper, stamp 'shine' using embossing ink and sprinkle white embossing powder. Heat to set and colour the letters with the glitter marker. Fix above the pink strip using foam pads, trimming the ends into a 'v'.

### Inspired by the season

Each month we give our contributors a challenge of using a photo, a scene to represent that month, and see how it can inspire their cardmaking. This month Faye has made this beautiful design featuring a Copic wheat field and adorable field mouse.

Create a 14.5cm square white card blank with the fold at the top. Cut Kraft card slightly smaller than the card front, distress the edges with a distressing tool or pair of scissors and attach to the card front.

2 Stamp the mouse (using a Mini MISTI if you wish) on white card using black ink. Keeping the mouse to the left, trim to measure 14cm square.

3 Using a make-up sponge and blue ink, sponge clouds over the top half of the panel. Colour the image with the Copics listed in the guide, then add white gel dots to the butterfly wings.

A Stamp the mouse again on scrap paper and cut out to make a mask. Cover the first image with low tack tape. Use the different shades of Copics to make brush strokes behind the mouse to form the wheat.

5 Stamp the sentiment to the right of the mouse.

Distress the edges of the panel.
Wrap cheesecloth around the bottom and secure the ends at the back. Tie twine twice around the cheesecloth, tying in a bow on the left. Fix to the

centre of the Kraft card on the card front.

### Easy easels!



An easel is a popular shape in cardmaking, but have you tried a twisted easel? So simple! Use this one collection, Folkland by Dovecraft, for all of your décor!

### Classic easel

Create a 15.2cm square Kraft card blank with the fold at the top. Score a horizontal line across the middle of the card front and mountain fold to form an easel shape.

2 Cut a 15.2cm square from Kraft card and attach to the bottom of the folded card so it stands when the card is folded.

Cover the upright card and the easel base with cream patterned paper measuring 14.5cm square.

Cut a 14.5x8cm strip of pink rose paper to 14.5x 8cm, trim the right sid into a fishtail and stick to the top left of the upright card.

Using the same paper, cut a 14.5x4cm strip and stick across the bottom of the easel base.

Stick a heart frame to the top left corner at an angle. Add three wooden butterflies in and around the frame.

Cut a length of butterfly ribbon to 16cm, the rose ribbon to 13cm and the 'just for you' ribbon to 10cm. Add double-sided tape to the back of each

one, keeping the ends free from adhesive so they can overhang the card. Stick and overlap them under the frame as shown.

Mount the sentiment on top of a gold glitter frame and attach to the easel base with foam pads to form a stopper when the card is folded.



### Twisted easel

Create a 15.2cm square Kraft card blank with the fold on the right. Score a diagonal line from the top left corner down to the bottom right corner and mountain fold to make your twisted easel card blank.

2 Cover the folded triangle with strips of the floral washi tape, trimming the edges flush.

3 Cut blue floral paper slightly smaller than the easel base and secure in place.

Trim foil arrow paper to 13.5cm square and stick to the centre of the easel base.

Decorate the folded triangle with a heart foil frame and sentiment topper. Add a wooden butterfly to the bottom left corner of the frame.



5 Cut the 'with love' ribbon to 14cm long and stick diagonally across the easel base. Add a strip of floral washi tape below.

Die-cut a tag from cream patterned paper and fix to the ribbon with foam pads, to act as a stopper when the easel is folded.

Die-cut four butterflies and stamp detail over the top. Once dry, fix around the tag, applying adhesive to the body only. Lift the wings for added dimension.

### Fun with frames

You don't have to make a shaped card blank to add variety to your cards, contributor Kitty has used three different die-cut frames to make these magical stamped unicorns by Clearly Besotted stand out from the crowd.

### Fairy tale

Create a 10x13.3cm white card blank with the fold at the top. Die-cut a Wonky Stitched Rectangle from white card to fit the card front and stick in place.

Trim white card to 7.5x10.5cm.
Gently apply some Broken China
Distress oxide around the card using a blending tool or brush.

Die-cut a Stitched Rectangles Frame from lilac card and attach over the inked panel with foam pads. Attach to the card front.

Die-cut three Stitched Clouds from white card and attach around the card front with foam pads.

5 Stamp the sentiment on white card. Trim to size, round the corners and attach to the right of the card front with foam pads.

Stamp and colour three unicorns using your choice of medium.
Carefully cut out and fix to each cloud with foam pads.

Add some gems around the inked panel to finish.



Use foam pads/tape to make your unicorns stand out from the frame!

- Add three gems below the sentiment to finish.



Create a 13.5x10.5cm white card blank with the fold at the top. Cover the card front with grey card. Die-cut the scalloped rectangle from the Blueprints 27 set from white card and stick to the card front.

Trim white card to 11x8cm and apply some Broken China over it. Die-cut the frame from the set from lilac card and attach to the inked panel with foam pads. Fix to the centre of the card front.

Combine scalloped and straight lines!



### What do I need?

The bright side

Stitched Rectangles STAX & Stitched Tag Corner Rectangle Frames by Die-namics

### The bright side

1 Create a 9.5x12.8cm white card blank with the fold at the top.

Trim white card slightly larger than the card front and die-cut using a Stitched Rectangle. Blend Broken China around the panel, leaving the edges free of ink. When dry, fix to the card front.





3 Die-cut three Stitched Tag Corner Rectangle Frames from lilac card and attach down the left-hand side of the card front with foam pads.

4 Stamp two unicorns and a rainbow on white card, colour and fussy cut.
Fix one inside each frame with foam pads.

5 Stamp the sentiment on white card, trim to size and attach to the bottom right corner of the card front with foam pads.

Finish by adding gems around the right-hand side of the card front.

Create a 13x17.5cm white card blank. Cut orange card to 12.2x16.8cm and mount on black card. Fix to the card front.

Cut patterned paper to 10.5x15cm and mount on black card. Attach to the centre of the card front.

Cut orange card to 3x6cm, mount on black card and fix to the centre left of the card front with foam pads. Trim a topper to 10x13cm, layer on black card and adhere to the card front slightly right of centre using foam pads.

Cut three small circles from black card and attach to the orange panel.


Print out the sentiment, trim to size and mount on black card. Fix to the bottom right of the topper with foam pads.



1 Create a 13x17.5cm white card blank. Cut patterned paper to 12.5x17cm and mount on black card. Fix to the card front.

2 Cut pink card to 6.5x17cm and mount on black card. Attach to the right side of the card front.

Trim a topper to 9x13cm and double mount on pink followed by black card. Attach to the centre of the card front using foam pads.

4 Layer a circular sentiment on black card, then adhere to the bottom right corner using foam pads.

### Dare to dream

Create a 14.5cm square white card blank with the fold at the top. Score a diagonal line from the top left corner down to the bottom right corner on the card front. Mountain fold to form an easel shape.

2 Cut patterned paper to 13.7cm square and mount on dark blue card measuring 14cm square. Fix to the easel base.

Cut a 13.5cm square from the same paper and cut diagonally in half to form two triangles. Mount both on dark blue card and attach either side of the easel score line.

Trim a topper to 9.5x14.5cm and double mount on red followed by dark blue card. Use foam pads to attach it to the bottom of the folded easel so it stands upright.

Print out a sentiment, mount on black card and fix to the easel base to act as a stopper when the easel is folded.

### Birthday song

Create a 15.5cm square white card blank.

2 Cut light blue card to 15cm square. Add a 145x10.5cm piece of patterned paper to the top. Wrap ribbon around the bottom of the paper, securing in a knot on the left. Fix the panel to the card front.

Trim a topper to 10x12.5cm and double mount on light blue followed by black card. Fix to the centre of the card front with foam pads.

4 Mount a sentiment on black card and attach to the bottom right corner using foam pads.

Add the statement topper to a twisted easel for a different shaped card!

1 Cut Kraft card to measure 28x14cm. Score vertical lines at 7cm and 14cm. Mountain fold the first line and valley fold the second to create a card blank. Attach gingham paper measuring 6.5x13.5cm to the card front and the same paper measuring 13.5cm square to the card inside.





- 2 Cut a 28x5cm strip of Kraft card. Score vertical lines at 14cm and 21cm from the left. Mountain fold the first line and valley fold the second.
- Attach gingham paper measuring 13.5x4.5cm to the longer section and a 6.5x4.5cm piece to the middle section. Attach the strip to the left and right of the card blank, secure just the edges to form a strip that closes with the card.
- Use black ink to stamp the sentiment on white card measuring 6x4.5cm and fix to the last panel on the strip.
- 5 Stamp the little girl on white card measuring 7.5x10cm. Stamp the moon and stars above her.






GHT to guide y

- The stamp the three stars down the top, middle and bottom of the card front, the middle of the strip and the top and bottom right of the card inside.
- Finish by adding pink gems to the top left and bottom right of the stamped panel.

### Twinkle paws

Create a 14cm square light blue card blank with the fold at the top. Using the largest Go Kreate circle die, create a circle card blank. Score a horizontal line across the middle of the card front and mountain fold. Die-cut a light blue circle and fix to just the bottom half of the folded over section to create an easel card blank.

Die-cut two middle-sized circle dies from checked paper.

Attach one to the easel base and one to the upright circle.

Create the stopper for the easel by die-cutting circles from gingham paper and light blue card the same size as before. Trim the blue circle to 4cm wide and the gingham circle to 3.5cm wide. Layer together and position on the easel base with foam pads.

4 Stamp the cat on white card and die-cut with the 8cm Pierced Circle. Colour and mount on a blue Pierced Circle, the next size up. Attach to the upright circle.

5 Stamp the sentiment on white card measuring 5.5x3cm and mount on light blue card measuring 6x3.5cm. Fix to the centre of the stopper. Finish by adding a gem either side.

### Tree of stars

1 Cut Kraft card to 14cm square and round the bottom two corners. Trim pink dotted paper to 13cm square and layer on white card measuring 13.5cm square, rounding the bottom two corners each time.

2 Cut a second piece of Kraft card measuring 7x28cm, score across the middle and fold. Attach the bottom half to the back of the square, so the top half folds over the front, creating a card blank. Round the bottom two corners.

3 Cut pink dotted paper to 6x13cm, round the bottom corners and layer on white card measuring 6.5x13.5cm, again rounding the corners. Fix to the card front.

4 Use black ink to stamp the tree and sentiment on white card. Colour and trim to 9x11.5cm. Stamp the single hanging star in the bottom left corner and again on pink dotted paper. Trim and layer over the first star.

# What do I need? Tree of stars All items at start plus: Kraft card Pink dotted paper Corner rounder punch Tree of Stars stamp set by Little Claire Designs Pink adhesive gems Adhesive pearl

5 Round the bottom two corners and mount on Kraft card measuring 9.5x12cm, again rounding the bottom two corners. Attach to the card front.

Crystal Stickles

Apply glitter glue to the dots either side of the tree trunk and around the stars. Add a pink gem to each corner of the stamped panel and a pearl to the centre of the hanging star.

### Creative curves

Get creative with your circular dies to make shaped cards — we love how new contributor Laura has taken the fluid look and adapted it for a water theme with alcohol inks and introduces Yupo paper!

### What do I need?

#### For all cards

- White card
- Splash stamp set & dies by Avery Elle
- Yupo paper, Alcohol Ink Blending Solution & Stream, Pool & Stonewashed inkpads by Ranger
- Onyx Black VersaFine inkpad
- Zig Clean Color Real Brush pens
- Drinking straw

### Splash

- All items above plus:
- ☐ VersaMark inkpad
- White embossing powder

#### Keep calm

- All items at start plus:
- □ VersaMark inkpad
- White embossing powder
- Moonstone Circle Nesting dies

### What is

Yupo paper is 100% recyclable, super smooth and holds ink with razor sharp precision. It is also a waterproof, synthetic tree-free paper!

### Splash

Create a 13.5x10cm white card blank. Using the swimming pool die from the coordinating set, die-cut the shape from the card blank, ensuring part of the fold is still intact on the left edge.

Use the step by steps to create an inked background. Die-cut the swimming pool shape again from the inked piece.

Treat the centre of the pool piece with an anti-static tool, then stamp the sentiment with VersaMark ink. Pour over white embossing powder and set with a heat tool. Adhere the pool panel to the card front.

Stamp the images on white card, colour with the Zig pens, then die-cut using the coordinating dies.

Add the images to the card front

### Keep calm

Use the step by steps to create your inked background. Using two circle dies, one slightly bigger than the other, work out where the circles will overlap to create the figure of eight pool shape. Mark with a pencil where the two dies meet on both sides, then run through your die-cutting machine with the first circle, cutting up to the marks only.

Repeat with the second die, once again only cutting up to the meeting point.

Stamp the sentiment using VersaMark ink after treating the area with an anti-static tool, pour over some white embossing powder and set with a heat tool.

> Laura used Bristol Smooth card for stamping and colouring!

> > KEEP

FLOAT



Be really careful when using a heat tool with Yupo paper as it can melt the paper. Use short sharp bursts to melt the powder.



Why not team this technique with your free Craft Paper Collection? Create a 9x13cm white card blank and adhere the pool to the card front, ensuring it is close to the fold, leaving a gap as wide as the white edge will be.

5 Cut around the edge of the pool, keeping the same distance all the way around, creating the white edge and ensuring that you leave some of the fold intact.

Cut a sliver from the bottom of the card base enabling the card to stand up.

Stamp the images on white card with black ink and colour with Zig pens. Die-cut the images using the coordinating dies and attach to the card front.

Chill with us

All items at start plus:

Sweet and Cool stamp set by Concord & 9th

### Chill with us

Create a 13cm square white card blank with the fold at the top.
Using the largest circle die, cut a circular card blank, overhanging the top edge to keep the fold intact.


Pollow the step by steps to create an inked background. Using the scalloped circle die that is smaller than the circle, die-cut a panel from the inked piece. Add the scalloped circle to the centre of the card front.

3 Cut a sliver off the bottom to enable the card to stand.

4 Stamp the sentiment on white card with black ink and trim to size Fix to the centre of the card front with double-sided tape.

5 Stamp the images on white card and colour with Zig pens. Die-cut with the coordinating dies. Finish by attaching all the images around the sentiment.


### How to create your alcohol ink background:




Take your Yupo paper, cover with blending solution and dot your chosen colours of alcohol ink liberally all over.



Add dots of a lighter colour of ink.



Apply dots of the blending solution. This will lighten the overall effect and create a bleached look where placed.



Use a drinking straw to blow the ink around the piece until desired effect is achieved. Leave until completely dry.

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

- 3 Stamp and die-cut leaves and three flowers in different purple tones from another piece of white card. Arrange them in the middle of the square and secure in place. Fix the square to the centre of the card front with foam pads.
- Stamp 'Thank you' on black card and sprinkle with white embossing powder. Add heat to set. Trim into a rectangle and fix across the middle of the card front.
- Add a few white pearls around the flowers to finish.

### It's your birthday

- 1 Create a 14.8cm square white card blank.
- Die-cut two 13cm squares from white card and die-cut a large heart aperture in the centre of one.
- 3 Stamp and die-cut some leaves and five flowers in different purple tones on white card. Fix to the white square. Put the heart aperture loosely on top to make sure no white gaps are showing, then secure in place with foam pads. Attach to the middle of the card front.
- 4 Stamp your sentiment on black card, sprinkle with white embossing powder and heat to set. Trim to size and fix to the right of the heart aperture using foam pads.
- Finish by adding two white pearls below the sentiment.

### How I made it...

This project was made using a scanned and printed copy of a previous gelli print I had made and kept in my stash – this way I can use them again and again! Using a stamping platform, I lined up my stamp, #75 Vocalist from AALL & Create, and card onto a stamping platform as I would be stamping the image twice in the same

place. Using a black Versafine ink pad I stamped the image and allowed the ink to dry. I then painted some areas of the stamped design pink. Once the paint had dried I stamped the image again to put all the detail back in on top of the paint – this is why a stamping platform is used as it's a perfect way to ensure accuracy. The Rock

On sentiment is a stamp from Crafter's Companion which I added in black ink to the foot of the card. I then added a few splashes of pink paint and finished the whole card off by mounting the art onto a white DL card blank.
