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



All you need is love and a dog

Stamp the dogs and sentiment on a piece of white card in black ink. Colour with copics and add vertical doodle borders down each side. Trim the stamped panel to measure 6.5cmx10.5cm and mount on striped paper measuring 7.5cmx10.5cm. Cut and fold a piece of white card measuring 10.5cm square. Cut a piece of pale blue paper to measure 5cmx10.5cm high and attach to the left of the card front. Use a glue pen to attach the stamped image panel to the right of the card.



Pawsome!

I think you're pawsome

Stamp the dogs and sentiment on a piece of white card in black ink. Colour with copics and add doodle borders on each side. Trim the stamped panel to measure 10.5cmx8.5cm and mount on striped paper measuring 10.5cmx9.5cm. Cut and fold a piece of white card measuring 10.5cm square. Cut a piece of spotty paper measuring 10.5cmx5cm and attach to the top of the card front.

Secure the stamped image panel to the base of the card front.



Pink spotty card

Stamp the dogs on white card in black ink, colour with copics and trim around the edge, leaving a narrow border. Create a white rectangle top folding card, measuring 8.5cmx21cm. Die cut the slimline window die from white card and keep the negative parts. Cut spotty paper to measure 8.5cmx21cm high and attach to card front. Mount the die cut panel to the card front and fill in the negatives, as shown. Add dogs to the card front with foam pads. Attach sequins to the central dog panel.



Wake up, hug a dog

Stamp the dogs and sentiment on a piece of white card in black ink, colour with copics and trim around the edge of the dogs, leaving a narrow border. Create a white rectangle top folding card, measuring 21cmx8.5cm. Die cut the slimline window die from white card. Mount design paper and the sentiment behind the die cut, as shown. Attach the die cut panel to the card front. Add dogs to the empty panels with foam pads, finishing off with sequins around the sentiment.

With love fur-ever & For my lovely fur-iend

Stamp the dog on a piece of white card in black ink, colour with copics and trim around the edge, leaving a narrow border. Using the fourth largest die from the set, create a top folding circle card base from white card. Using the same die, cut two pieces of design paper. Cut the plain piece of design paper in half and tear the top half from the striped piece. Stamp a sentiment in black ink on the plain piece of design paper. Attach button twine to the striped piece of design paper and secure at the back. Attach design paper to the card front. Tie a bow on the button twine. Add the dog with foam pads.

white card and glue onto the card. Cut out the topper, mount onto white card then onto pink card and fix in place on the bright pink card with foam pads. Glue a felt flower onto the card. Add adhesive gems to finish.

Cut and fold white card to create an 11cmx14.5cm card blank. Glue a piece of pink card measuring 10cmx14cm and glue onto the card. Cut a strip of the blue paper, mount onto white card then onto glitter card and glue vertically on the card. Cut out the topper, mount onto white card then onto glitter card and attach onto the card with foam pads. Add Nuvo Drops onto the topper and allow to dry.

Cut and fold white card to create a 10.5cmx13cm card blank. Cut a piece of black card to measure 10cmx12.5cm and glue onto the card. Mount a piece of patterned paper measuring 5.5cmx11cm onto white card and glue onto the left side. Mount the topper onto white card and attach with foam

tape. Create a small fishtail banner from white card and glue onto the card. Add two Nuvo Drops and allow to dry.





Oh yay!

Create a card blank measuring 11.5cmx14.5cm and cover the front with pink card. Trim the background paper to measure 11cmx14cm and glue onto the pink card. Cut a strip of background paper, mount onto turquoise card and glue across the middle. Mount the topper onto turquoise card, then onto pink card and attach in place

with foam tape. Add adhesive gems onto the topper to finish.





Birthday blooms

Using white card create a 17cm square card blank. Create two squares from one of the patterned papers to measure 7cm and mount onto gold mirri card measuring 7.5cm square. Fix in



the top left and bottom right corners using foam pads. Cut out two toppers to 8.5cm square and fix in the opposite corners. Fix a sentiment to the centre to finish.

Yay for stars

Mount the topper onto blue card then onto white card and secure

Tie a bow using ribbon, glue in place and add a blue button to the centre.

Create a 10.5x12.5cm white card blank.

2 Cut green patterned paper to measure 7x12.5cm. Wrap button twine twice around the bottom of the panel, securing at the back. Fix to the right of the card front.

Re-size the digital image to measure 12cm square and print on white card.

Colour the image using the markers listed below and die-cut using the second largest die from the set.

Attach the image panel to the left of the card front with foam pads.

Tie a bow around the button twine with two pieces of twine to finish.



For you

Cut and fold white card to create a 15cm square card blank. Cover with black card leaving a narrow border around all four sides. Cover with pink card, again leaving a narrow border. Cut two 10cm squares from black card stock and cover with patterned paper leaving a narrow border. Attach to the card front as shown. Cut a 9.5cm square from black card and cover with pink card stock leaving a narrow border. Stick one of the toppers to a piece of black card leaving a narrow border and attach to the pink square. Stick to the centre of the card front using foam pads. Computer generate a sentiment and attach to black card, and stick to the card front as shown. Attach three black pearls to the top right corner and the bottom left corner.

Lots of love

Cut and fold white card to create a 16x12.5cm side folding white card blank. Cover with black card stock leaving a narrow border. Cover the bottom two thirds of the card front with patterned paper leaving a narrow border and the top third with pink card stock also leaving a narrow border. Cut a fishtail banner from the other patterned paper and attach to the left of the card front as shown. Stick one of the toppers to a piece of black card stock leaving a narrow border and attach to the card front with foam pads. Computer generate a sentiment and attach to black card leaving a narrow border, sticking to the top right of the topper as shown. Attach three black pearls to the bottom right corner.

Me and you

Cut and fold white card to create a 15cm square side folding card blank. Cover with black card, leaving a narrow border. Cover with pink card leaving a narrow border. Cut a 12.5cm square from black card and cut four 6cm squares, two from each of the patterned papers and stick to the black card stock leaving a narrow border, then secure to the centre of the card front. Wrap with ribbon and secure with a knot. Stick one of the toppers to a piece of black card stock leaving a narrow border and attach to the centre of the card front using foam pads. Computer generate a sentiment and attach to black card stock leaving a narrow border, then stick to the card front.

Together forever

Cut and fold white card to create an 18x14cm top white card blank. Cover with black card stock leaving a narrow border. Stick two of the toppers to two pieces of black card leaving a narrow border. Stick to the card front as shown using foam pads. Cut two fishtail banners, one from black card stock and one from red card, sticking to the top right corner of the card front. Computer generate a sentiment and attach to black card stock leaving a narrow border. Stick to the bottom left corner of the card front using foam pads.

- Alcohol inkpads and tool for applying the inks

- □ 5x7 Gel Press
- White Posca paint pen

Lifting wet ink

- All items above plus


For a worn, textured look, invest in a Gel Press and you can create a beautiful background! Use alcohol inks by Ranger for this inky look.

Lifting wet ink

- Create an 11.5x16.5cm white card blank, with the fold at the top.
- 2 Cut a second panel of white card measuring 10x15.2cm.
- Place the Gel Press onto a flat protected surface or non-stick craft sheet. Add a small amount of Chalk paint to the Gel Press, then roll your brayer through the paint over the press, adding a light layer of paint to the press (Picture A).
- Remove any excess paint from the brayer onto a scrap piece of card (which can be used for another background in other projects). Allow this thin layer of paint to dry -which will only take a few moments as Fresco Finish paints are fast drying by nature.
- Place the Sunflower stencil onto the Gel Press on the painted layer, then add a few drops of each alcohol ink onto the blending tool and apply the ink randomly around the stencil (Picture B). Allow the inks to dry, then remove the stencil from the press (Picture C).









Apply a small amount of Lake Wanaka paint to the press. Roll the paint over the press using a brayer, adding only a light and even layer (Picture D). Place the panel of white card onto the press and rub the back of the card to ensure good contact (Picture E). Remove the card from the press; this creates the first print. Some detail will remain on the press and this can be used for a second print.

Die-cut two different sized small circles from white card. Add a small amount of Lake Wanaka paint to a non-stick craft sheet. Roll the brayer lightly through the paint and brayer a light layer of paint onto each of the circles. Repeat the same process with Byzantium paint. Blend Wilted Violet Distress oxide around the edges of each of the circles.

Using a black fine liner, doodle some lines around each of the circles. Doodle some stems to each of the circle 'blooms'. Doodle a couple of hearts onto the circular pieces and stick above the stems.


Add a few delicate splatters of paint over the panel using a white Posca pen.

 $10^{\,\mathrm{Add}}$ a Quote Chip and Index Clip to the top right and bottom of the panel

Layer the panel on white card coloured with Wilted Violet, leaving a thin border and adhere to the card front.

ifting dry ink

Create an 11.5x16.5cm white top folding card blank.

Cut a second piece of white card to 10x15.2cm. For this card, we are going to take a second print from whatever ink and detail is remaining on the Gel Press from our first card (Picture F).

Follow Steps 3-6 from the previous card to brayer ink on the Gel Press. You need to press a little firmer when the white panel is on the press with this print as you are lifting dry layers of paint. Remove the card from the press and you achieve a lighter detail print (Picture G).

Use a black fine liner to doodle some lines around the outside edges of the panel.

Die-cut a small circle from white card. Apply colour using Step 7 from the previous card. Adhere the circle to the right of the panel. Draw around the circle with a black fine liner. Doodle a stem from the circle to the bottom of the panel.

Add a few delicate splatters of white paint over the panel using a Posca paint pen.

Add a Quote Chip to the bottom left of the panel.

Layer the panel on white card, coloured with Wilted Violet Distress oxide and attach to the card front.

Add some small cuttings from a vintage book to the panel

Bright blending

Blend coordinating Distress inkpads to make your brightest cards, even neon shades! They will certainly inject some colour into your life if the weather outside is gloomy!

What do I need?

For all cards

- ☐ White card
- Striped patterned paper
- Toucan of Friendship stamp set by Reverse Confetti
- ☐ Copic marker pens (see guide)

Blending pink

- All items above plus
- Stitched Rectangle Frames by Lawn Fawn
 - Die-cutting machine
- ☐ Picked Raspberry, Spiced Marmalade & Dried Marigold Distress inkpads
- Little Hello die by MFT
- Ebony Black Nuvo Drops by Tonic Studios

Blending green

- All items at start plus
- Mowed Lawn & Twisted Citron Distress inkpads
- Woodland Green Nuvo Drops by Tonic Studios

Which is brighter? Distress inkpads or oxides

"I tried and tested both Distress inkpads and Distress oxides to try and see which would give the brightest colour. The oxides gave a smoother blend but as they are opaque, despite the brighter colour, they come out a bit lighter. The Distress inks came out a lot brighter no matter which colour you use and still blend nicely. I went with Distress inks to create these projects, paired with bright and colourful stamped images to make the colours pop!"

Try using spray inks to see what different colours and effects you can make!

Blending pink

- Create a 10.5x14cm white top folding card blank.
- 2 Cut watercolour card the same size as the card front. Blend Picked Raspberry, Spiced Marmalade and Dried Marigold over the card, starting with the darkest colour first. Apply the colour lightly so you can go back and add more if you need to, to make it brighter or darker. Add the next colour and start overlapping the colours to help them blend.

"I played around with different types of card – super smooth card, printing paper, thin card and watercolour card. The watercolour card came out top for creating the brightest colours and also for blending!"





3 Use the first colour to go back over the top part and blend into the other colour. Repeat until a smooth blend is achieved. Attach the panel to the card front.

4 Cut a 10.5x3cm strip of striped paper and attach across the bottom of the card front.

Die-cut a frame from white card and also from black card. Glue them together slightly offset and attach to the card front with foam pads.

Die-cut 'hello' from black and white card, layer together and fix inside the frame with foam pads.

Stamp and colour the images using the Copic colour guide. Cut out each one and adhere to the bottom of the frame with foam pads.

Add three Nuvo Drops inside the frame to finish.

Blending green

Create a 10.5x14cm white card blank with the fold at the top.

Pollow Steps 2 and 3 from the previous card to blend together Mowed Lawn and Twisted Citron inks on a 10.5x14cm panel of watercolour card, leaving the very bottom white.

3 Stamp the flowers using Mowed Lawn ink around the top of the panel. Attach the panel to the card front.

Cut a thin strip of striped paper, black card and white card. Layer together, slightly offset, and fix to the left of the card front.

5 Stamp and colour the images using Copic markers and the colour guide provided. Carefully cut out each image and attach to the card front with foam pads.

Print out a sentiment (or stamp and cut out) and fix to the top right of the card front with foam pads.

Add Nuvo Drops below the sentiment to finish.

What do I need? Blending blue

- Mermaid Lagoon, Cracked Pistachio, Picked Raspberry & Mustard Seed Distress inkpads

Blending blue

Create a 10.5x14cm white card blank with the fold at the top.

Use Steps 2 and 3 from the first card to blend Mermaid Lagoon and Cracked Pistachio inks onto a 10.5x14cm watercolour panel, starting at the bottom and leaving the top free from colour.

Blend some Picked Raspberry ink onto a strip of white card and adhere along the bottom of the card front. Attach the panel to the card front.

Cut two thin strips; one from striped paper and another from black card and layer them along the top edge of the pink strip.

Apply Mustard Seed ink to watercolour card and die-cut using the 'Happy birthday' die. Stick the sentiment across the top of the card front. Stamp and colour the images with Copic markers using the colour guide.

Cut out each of the images and fix to the strips with foam pads.

Add three Nuvo Drops along the bottom right corner of the card front and allow to dry.



COLOURLESS BLENDER PEN

How do I make it?

1 Create an 11.5cm square white card blank. Cut heart patterned paper from the paper pad the same size and fix to the card front.

2 Stamp the image in black ink on white card, cut out and colour with alcohol markers.

To create the bokeh look in the background, place the point of the nib of the colourless blender pen onto the coloured background; varying the pressure and the amount of time you hold the nib down will create circles of different sizes and depths of colour.

/ Die-cut a piece of Kraft card with the

the sentiment on it in Potting Shed ink and fix to the coloured image.

Cut an 11cm square of patterned paper and wrap red ribbon three times around the centre of it, securing it at the back with tape. Fix the coloured image to the centre with foam pads. Layer this in the centre of the card front with foam pads.

Dot some
Stickles around
the image to add
to the illusion of
sparkle and light.

Sue used the two ribbon hearts in the photo as inspiration to make a design with two people in it, as the hearts look like they are leaning on each other. The stamped images she has used also has the two hands joining to make a heart shape, just like the hearts

in the photo. She wrapped red ribbon several times around a panel behind the main image to represent the ribbon in the photo. She cleverly used a colourless blending pen to create a bokeh effect through her use of dabbing, and this perfectly reflects the background in the photo.



Colour lifting techniques

Want to create different shades of colour? You can with colour lifting techniques! Lynn Stanborough shows you six different ways with different mediums.



The heat embossing traps the original colour underneath and the water colour lifts the area around.

Negative stamped background

- Using Distress oxides, cover a panel of white card. Make sure you use quality stamping card that can take quite a lot of water or alternatively use watercolour card. Allow to dry fully.
- Place the inked card onto your craft mat and have to hand the Flower Garden stamp, water spritzer and plenty of kitchen towel!
- From about 2ft in the air, spritz the stamp to ensure a good even coverage of water. As you turn the stamp over the water should not run off the stamp, if this does, wipe the stamp and spritz again with slightly less water (I gave 10 sprays and found this to be a good amount of water).
- Place the stamp onto the inked card and hold there for a little while to allow the water to activate the ink. If the ink is fresh this only needs to be a few seconds but if the ink has dried allow longer to ensure activation.
- As soon as the stamp has been removed, lay kitchen towel over to absorb the activated ink, change the kitchen towel when required.
- Allow to dry naturally or use a heat gun. As there has been a large amount of water applied to the card it will dry hard and may curl up. If this happens, once completely dry protect between scrap paper and run through your die-cutting machine a couple of times which will help to flatten it.
- Add the panel to your card front and finish with a die-cut sentiment and vellum heart.

What do I need? Lifting from heat embossing


fting from heat embossing

To create the positive background, blend a panel of white card with Distress oxides.

Rub an anti-static bag over the panel, then stamp Flower Garden with VersaMark. Sprinkle with clear embossing powder and heat to set.

Use a water spritzer over the embossing and mop up the colour using kitchen towel. The clear heat embossing has trapped the original colour underneath and the water has colour lifted the area around.

Attach the panel to a card front and finish with a die-cut sentiment and vellum heart.



Negative stencilled background

- White card
- Frostbite stencil by Simon Hurley
- Fossilized Amber, Candied Apple, Carved
- Pumpkin, Vintage Photo Distress oxides

Negative stencilled background

Use the Distress oxides to blend over white card.

To achieve the negative background, place the inked card onto your craft mat and have to hand a water spritzer, stencil and kitchen towel.

Spritz the Frostbite stencil about 10 times from around 2ft above to give an even water coverage.

Place the stencil waterside down onto the inked card. Immediately cover with kitchen towel and hold in place to absorb any water that oozes out of the stencil sides. Replace the kitchen towel as necessary.

Keeping the stencil in place, spritz and colour lift as many times as you like. Allow to dry or use the heat tool.

Finish by adding the panel to a card front with a vellum heart and die-cut sentiment.



Positive stencilled background


To create the positive background, blend Distress oxides over white card. Lay a dry Backsplash stencil over the inked card. Secure in place with either a repositionable stencil spray or tape.

What do I need? Positive stencilled background

White card

White card

- Backsplash stencil by Simon Hurley
- Fossilized Amber, Candied Apple, Carved Pumpkin & Vintage Photo Distress oxides




Immediately place the kitchen towel over to absorb the water - using baby wipes will also work.

Spritz and towel over as many times as you like.

Remove the stencil when ready and dry. The original ink colour was trapped underneath the stencil and the water has colour lifted the area around.

Finish by adding the panel to your card front with a vellum heart and die-cut sentiment.



Lifting with bleach

Blend Distress oxides over white card. Allow to dry.

Use black ink to stamp the buds from the Weekend Doodles set randomly around the panel. Heat emboss with clear embossing powder. If you are quick enough, the clear embossing powder will stick to the ink without having to re-stamp over in VersaMark ink. Allow to fully cool down.

Use a water brush pen or a fine paintbrush to add bleach to the water. Make sure you wash out the water brush as soon as you have finished.

Dab the bleach/water mix over the panel, then lift away the colour using kitchen towel.

Repeat this as many times as you like. The more times you paint and dab away, the whiter the image becomes. This is great if you want to highlight particular areas of the image.



ifting with water

Blend Distress oxides over a white panel of card. Allow to dry.

Use black ink to stamp the Wallpaper Art image at the top and bottom of the panel. Heat emboss with clear embossing powder.

Using a water pen or fine paintbrush and water, paint inside the stamped images and dab away using kitchen towel.

Repeat as many times as you like, the water will colour lift to reveal a different colour. Leave like this for a contrast or alternatively paint in another colour as I have done to the flower, in Candied Apple.

Attach the panel to the card front and add a die-cut sentiment and vellum heart.



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


TOP TIP!

Use a wet glue when attaching the hearts as this allows for you to move the hearts into place more easily.


How to attach your punched hearts



Punch, score and fold the hearts in different colours



Glue a folded heart under the thread and then glue a matching coloured heart on top of the thread so the thread is sandwiched together.



Wrap some thread onto a piece of spare card and secure the ends with washi tape.




The filled hearts are ready to use in your project.



Use substantial card or watercolour card when adding watercolour to your projects. Thinner card will simply warp. If your card does warp a little, weight it overnight to help flatten it.

Love

- Create a 10.5x16.5cm white card blank. Trim a slightly smaller piece of red card. Die-cut a partial circle from the left-hand side of the red panel.
- Stamp and heat emboss in black the 'love' sentiment onto the white panel.



- 3 Using the Indigo and Aqua Splash pens, scribble some ink onto an acrylic block. Use a water brush to add water and watercolour around the sentiment to create an uneven splodge.
- Punch, score and fold the hearts in different colours. Follow the steps to attach the hearts to thread.
- Remove the thread once filled with hearts and secure onto the white

embossed panel. Fix foam pads to the ends of the threads to keep secure. Add some gel pen dashes onto some of the hearts.

- Add foam pads to the reverse of the red die-cut panel. Adhere to the card front. Add a white gel pen dashed line around the circular edge.
- Add lots of little black and white dots around the sentiment and hearts and add a few punched crosses to finish.



Hugs

- Create a 14.5cm square silver card blank. Add a smaller red layer and cut out a smaller white layer.
- 2 Stamp and heat emboss in silver the 'hugs' sentiment onto the white panel.
- 3 Scribble some Aqua Splash Flow pen onto an acrylic block. Using a water brush, add water and watercolour around the sentiment to create an uneven splodge of colour.
- 4 Punch, score and fold the hearts in different colours. Follow the step by steps to secure the hearts to the card front with thread.

5 Remove the thread once filled with hearts and wrap over the white embossed panel. Attach to the back. Add some gel pen dashes onto some of the hearts.

Add lots of little black and white dots around the sentiment and hearts and add a few punched crosses to finish.



Kisses tag

- 1 Cut an 8.5x17cm piece of turquoise card, then trim a smaller piece of white card.
- 2 Stamp and heat emboss in black the 'kisses' sentiment onto the white panel.
- 3 Using the Red Apple Aqua Flow pen, scribble some onto an acrylic block. Using a water brush, add water and then watercolour around the sentiment to create an uneven splodge of colour.
- Punch, score and fold the hearts in different colours. Follow the steps to attach the hearts to thread.

Wrap the hearts over the white embossed panel. Attach to the card panel. Add some gel pen dashes onto some of the hearts.

Add lots of little black and white dots around the sentiment and hearts and add a few punched crosses.

Punch a hole in the top of the tag and decorate with some twine to finish.



- Dark Purple inkpad
- Black VersaFine inkpad

- 1 Create a 17cm square white card blank with the fold at the top.
- 2 Cut patterned paper to 15cm square and mount on purple card, leaving a thin border. Fix to the centre of the card front.
- Print off image from Mo's Digital Pencil onto smooth white card the size of this image is approximately 8x11cm.
- Colour the image with your alcohol markers or other chosen colouring medium. Paint Wink of Stellar onto the wings for a sparkly effect.

- Die-cut a label from white card to fit the image, then ink the edges with purple ink.
- Stamp the sentiment on white card using black ink and die-cut with a smaller die from the Labels set, again inking the edges.
- Cut a strip of co-ordinating patterned paper approximately 4x14cm and layer on slightly larger purple card. Fix vertically to the left-hand side of the card front.
- Attach the image to the right-hand side of the card front with foam pads. Fix the sentiment to the left, overlapping the image, also with foam pads.

Spread sunshine

Create a 17cm top folding white card blank.

Mount a page of patterned paper onto slightly larger yellow card and fix to the centre of the card front.

3 Cut a 15x5cm strip of the same paper, mount on yellow card and adhere across the bottom of the card front.

Print off the image, to approximately 10x9cm. Colour with alcohol markers and add Wink of Stellar to the wings. Diecut with the arch die.

To get a coordinating layer, draw round the outer edge of the same die on yellow card and cut out by hand. Layer the image in the centre and attach to the right-side of the card front.

Using dies from the Wildflower set, cut a flower from yellow card and foliage from brown card and arrange to the left of the image panel.

Stamp the sentiment on white card, cut into a thin strip trimming one end into a fish-tail shape. Repeat with a slightly longer yellow piece of card and layer the sentiment over the top. Fix to the bottom left corner of the card front.

Finish by adding yellow pearls to the top right and bottom left of the card front.

Die-cut the image with a Wonky Stitched Rectangle, then a sentiment with a Stitched Oval. Layer the image on

slightly larger brown card, then the oval on a die-cut Oval Frame from brown card. Adhere the oval to the bottom right of the card front and the image panel to the top left.

Die-cut a variety of leaves from various autumnal coloured card. Attach around the image panel and oval.

Add a few sequins around the image to finish.



- 2 Cut blue patterned paper to 11x16cm and adhere to the silver card. Make some zig-zag marks with a black fine liner pen to represent stitching along the edges of the blue paper.
- 3 Glue the stained lace across the card front, just below centre. Add three pieces of jute twine over the top of the lace.

- Die-cut a Trinket Frames from silver card and sand to distress it. Adhere to the card front with foam pads, over the left of the jute twine.
- Die-cut a selection of flowers from blue and cream coloured card, and leaves from green card.
- Glue the flowers and leaves inside the frame and finish their centres with Stone Drops.
- Die-cut letters from cream card to spell 'love'. Attach along with a quote chip to the top of the card front.

"Instead of getting rid of old lace, I scrunched it and sprayed it with a couple of colours of spray stains and allowed it to dry. So glad that I didn't throw it out once I saw what it looked like!"

A heart for my Valentine

Create a 12.5x17.8cm white card blank. Cut Kraft core card to fit the card front and sand to distress. Fix to the card front.

Cut patterned paper to 11x16.3cm and distress the edges. Fix to the card front and draw some random zig zag stitches to replicate stitching with a black fine liner.

Attach your stained lace just below centre and trim the ends flush. Add the strips of jute across the lace and a bow to the middle.

Colour card with Candied Apple and Aged Mahogany Distress spray stain. When dry, spritz with Aged Mahogany oxide spray. When dry and happy with the deep colour, die-cut the Faceted Heart. Build the heart as per the manufacturer instructions. Attach just above the lace.

Colour your Quote chips and computer generated words with a little Ground Espresso ink, then adhere to the top and bottom of the card front.

Use a Sizzix die to make this heart!





How to create your own grungy backing paper

Don't have the right shade of paper for your card? Make your own!

Lay white card inside a cardboard box to protect your surfaces. Spray with Weathered Wood spray stain and spritz with a small amount of water. Dry it with the heat

tool. Come back in again with the same colour and spray a little more, building up the colour. Blot as necessary with paper towel.

Swap to Tumbled Glass and Pumice Stone spray stains and spray here and there allowing the first two layers to remain visible. Dry this layer too and then add some Stormy Sky. Have


the water spray bottle handy and soften the colours by spraying and blotting after each addition.

Finish with a spray of Pumice Stone oxide spray. When this is dry (some things are best left to dry naturally and some benefit from being hurried up with the heat tool), spritz with plain water,

allowing patterns to form.

This is the main method for colouring papers and you can use them for backgrounds with stamps on or for diecutting any shapes at all. For neautral paper, try Antique linen spray

stain and Old Paper oxide stain. Have fun and create your own colour combinations

How to achieve a dip dye effect

Jeni uses Aqua Pigments by Brutus Monroe to blend and create beautiful dip dye backgrounds!

Dip dye blue

1 Use the technique explained below to create a dip-dyed background using blue pigment, then blue violet, then black.

Once dry, using embossing ink, stamp the word sentiments around the background from the Dream Big stamp set, letting some go off the edges of the card and emboss with white embossing powder.

What do I need?

All items plus

☐ Brutus Monroe Aqua Pigments in Blue,
Blue Violet and Black

3 Stamp the mountain from the Mountain of Thanks stamp set onto smooth card, and emboss with black embossing powder. Colour with the pink, yellow, orange, green and blue Aqua Pigments and a paintbrush.

Die-cut the coloured mountains and some clouds from the coordinating set and white card.

Create a white card blank measuring 14.5x22.5cm from watercolour card.

Trim the background to 9x21cm and fix to the card front using foam pads, just left of centre. Fix the mountains to the card base layering them at different heights to finish.

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN DIP DYE AND OMBRE?

They are similar, however dip dye usually involves brighter colours and a less smooth gradient in colour - ombre is more blended.



How to create a dip dye effect

- Tape watercolour card to your craft surface to secure in place.
 Using a flat brush, and starting from the bottom working your way to the top using your chosen pigment, work long strokes across the width of the card. Add water to lighten the colour near the top of the card.
- Let the pigment dry naturally or use a heat gun to speed the process up between each colour layer.
- Add more colour in the same way but only a third of the way up the card at slightly different angles so there is no straight line across the card.
- Add the next colour, a slightly darker shade but this time not applying the strokes as high up as the last colour.
- Add pigment mixed with black to the bottom part of the card, dry and add more if needed to deepen the colour.

Dip dye orange

Use the technique explained to create a dip-dyed background using yellow pigment,

What do I need?

All items plus

Brutus Monroe Aqua Pigments in Yellow,Orange, Pink and Red

then orange, pink, red then black.

2 Stamp encouraging word sentiments from the Dream Big stamp bundle around the background using embossing ink and emboss with white embossing powder.

3 Stamp the mountains onto white card and emboss with black embossing powder. Colour with pink, blue, green and red and a paintbrush.

4 Die-cut the coloured mountains and some clouds from white card.

Trim the background piece to 11x19cm and attach the mountains, approx1.5cm from the bottom edge, trim off any overhang.

Create a card blank measuring 12x20cm from white watercolour card and attached the background to the centre. Fix the clouds between the sentiments to finish.

Dip dye green

Use the technique explained to create a dip-dyed background using yellow, then green,



turquoise then blue green. Add two layers of blue to deepen the colour, drying between each layer. Add more yellow in the middle third to brighten the colour. Do not go over the lighter area at the top. Use water to lighten the colour at the top of each colour and to help blend between the shades and black to the bottom of the card.

2 Stamp encouraging word sentiments around the background and emboss with white embossing powder.

3 Stamp the mountains onto white card and emboss with black embossing powder. Leave uncoloured to help the background stand out.

Die-cut the mountains and some clouds from white card.

Trim the background to 10x18cm and attach the mountains along the base of the card. Use foam pads for some, and liquid glue for others to give dimension.

Create a card blank from watercolour card measuring 12.5x20cm and attach the background piece just left of centre. Adhere clouds between the sentiments to finish.

Colour it clear!

Following on from Sue's tutorial last issue showing how to colour glowing light, this issue Sue shows how your alcohol markers can create the effect of clear glass!

What do I need?

- White card (for card blank and also suitable for alcohol marker pens)
- ☐ 6x6 Believe in Magic paper pad by First Edition
 ☐ Shadow Grey & Watering Can Archival inkpads
- Mason Jar of Hearts & Ellie Loves Phant' Stuffies rubber stamps by Stamping Bella
- Selection of Copic marker pens (see guide)
- Lots of Hearts Stencil by MFT
- Polychromos pencils in red, green, white, yellow & grey
- Square Layering dies by Tonic Studios
- Die-cutting machine
- Scattered Straw Distress oxide
- Star Dust Stickles

Top tip! Always place a piece of card underneath the card you are colouring on,

as this will soak up any excess ink.

Guide to using Copic marker pens:

GROUND:CO, GOO, G41, YG41

How do I make it?

- Create a 12.5cm square white card blank. Cover the card front with patterned paper from the paper pad.
- With grey ink, stamp the image on white card and die-cut it with the 10.5cm square die, so the image is very slightly left of centre.
- 2 Colour the image as shown with pencils.

- Place the stencil over the coloured image and use R000 to add some hearts inside the jar. This will give the impression of depth to the jar and it will not look so flat (Picture A).
- With C01, add definition to the top and bottom of the jar, colouring just inside the lines. Also, draw around the lefthand side of the label as shown to give the impression of a shadow (Picture B).
- With C0, colour the base of the jar and with G0000, colour the ground underneath it (Picture C).
- Using a red and green pencil, add some fine lines to the outline of the jar as shown, colouring just inside the outline and over and around the grey alcohol marker already added. This gives the impression of a reflection in the glass from the red hearts and the green ground (Picture D).
- Use C00 to colour just inside the pencil lines, all around the inside edge of the jar. This will add depth to the jar and help to make it look rounded (Picture E). Do not let the nib of the marker touch the pencil marks pencils and alcohol markers do not mix and the pencil will spoil the nib of the marker.
- With the white pencil, gently colour some vertical stripes over the jar (Picture F). This gives the impression that light is reflected from the glass the lines will only be faint but they do help add dimension.
- Place the image back inside the 10.5cm square die and gently blend Scattered Straw around the edges (See main image).

How to create a clear glass effect.













Use Watering Can ink to stamp'l love you' on white card and cut out each word. Fix to the right-hand side of the image.

With a yellow pencil very lightly add \angle some patches of yellow inside the jar around the hearts. This gives the impression that the yellow background can be seen

through the glass jar. Additionally, add some shade underneath the jar, the lid and the ribbon with a grey pencil. Fix the image to the card front.



- Cut black card to 14x10.8cm and stamp the sentiment along the bottom. Sprinkle with Lime Green and heat to emboss.
- Die-cut the heart beat die twice from Kiwi card. Adhere the first from the edge above the sentiment and then join the second and trim off on the left (top tip - pick which area you want to be on show, as how it joins doesn't matter as it is hidden behind the doctor image).
- Die-cut the scalloped border from pink patterned paper and adhere around the edges of the black card. Attach the panel to the card front.
- Adhere the doctor in place to finish the card.



This lime green embossing powder really stands out against the black card once embossed


How to paper piece your image



Stamp your image onto a base card and colour the face and any other flesh tone areas - you may need to stamp the image twice so you can cut out hands etc which are on top of clothing.



Cut the images out using scissors or a craft knife. For some layers that will be covered up you don't need to cut everything – you can leave bits to be covered.



Select your papers and stamp the image onto them ready to cut out. Top tip – to save paper you can just stamp the areas you want from each paper rather than the whole image.



Layer the cut pieces onto the base image – you can see here an example of where the layer beneath wasn't fully cut as the coat covers up the coat on the blue layer of the clipboard.



- Create a 14x10.8cm white card blank with the fold at the top.

- Die-cut 13 of the largest plasters from the MFT set from striped paper in the Flower Market paper pad. Adhere in rows across the card front, allowing some to overhang. Trim the excess.

- Die-cut 'hugs' and place centrally on the card front. Stamp the 'sending' above it.
- Attach the doctor and nurse at either side of the sentiment to complete.

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HANDPICKED

Handpicked is the chance for us to share the card design of a reader that has been sent to us via post or email, or perhaps that we have seen on social media. It's to give credit to everyone at just how fantastic you can be using your skills and the amazing products available to us all! This stunning design was created by Carole Wright.



How I made it...

Using white card I created a card blank measuring 15cm square then covered the whole of the card front with a pretty pink paper. Using white card and the Heartfelt Creations Stairway Gardens Die, I die-cut one complete component and fixed it to the front. Next I stamped the Scroll from the Lush Lilacs Collection by Heartfelt Creations onto white card using Ranger Archival Coffee Ink and a sentiment onto the front of the scroll. I die-cut with the coordinating die and coloured in the elements with my chosen medium - Zig water brush markers. I fixed this to the bottom right corner of the card using foam pads. To make the roses, I stamped lots of leaves and petals, using Coffee ink, onto

Heartfelt Flower Making Paper and coloured them with Ranger Distress Victorian Velvet Pink ink and Ranger Archival Leaf Green Ink. I die-cut them with the co ordinating dies. I placed all the leaves and petals into the corresponding Heartfelt Creations flower shaping molds, lightly spritzed them with water and ran them through my die-cutting machine. I tapped them out then when dry and lightly shaped them with a flower shaping ball tool (If you don't have a mold, you can still shape well with a ball tool and a foam mat). To make the rose buds I took the smallest die-cut petals and adhered each petal to another one at a time. I repeated with the same size petal then the next size up etc. In total I made three large flowers, one
